Welcome to our October newsletter.
Last month we had a very well attended
Social to mark the painting of the hall.
We preceded the Social with talks about
Caulerpa and stoat eradication which
attracted around forty people.
Craig Thorburn, a marine biologist, and
Blair Anderson, reported on their latest
dives and courses of action available to
control exotic Caulerpa. It has been
found in waters at Great Barrier Island,
Great Mercury Island, Te Rāwhiti Inlet in
the Bay of Islands, Kawau Island, and

Waiheke Island in the Hauraki Gulf. These exotic seaweeds can spread rapidly and could affect native species as they quickly form huge mats and suffocate native flora and fauna underneath. Help to stop the spread. Keep an eye out for exotic caulerpa and report suspected sightings to the Ministry of Primary Industries. Take a photo, if possible, and note the location. Then either freephone <u>0800 80 99 66</u> or complete the online form at <u>report.mpi.govt.nz</u> You can also call DOC's conservation emergency hotline 0800 DOC HOT (0800 362 468). This engaging presentation was followed by an equally inspiring report from Steve Cook of Te Korowai on the stoat eradication programme on Waiheke. Stoat numbers have been reduced to two or three active females making eradication an achievable goal. Now is the time when the breeding season starts so please report any sightings to Te Korowai (0800 24737664). The most likely area is around Onetangi Road towards the quarry, so keep an eye out for them.

Rob Velseboer (https://organicediblegarden.co.nz) ran an extremely successful workshop on preparing garden beds for spring: seeds, soil and planting. To all those
